

Internal Medicine at Angelo Hospital is a specialized Unit within the Department of Medicine and Oncohematology with an Emergency Care Unit. It takes a holistic approach to clinical issues, offering a comprehensive view of diseases that affect multiple organs and systems.

The qualifying and distinctive role of Internal Medicine is to manage complex patients with the aim of avoiding fragmentation in the presence of multiple, often concomitant diseases. It is characterized by multidisciplinary (the ability to deal with very different tasks and events in medical pathology), multi-competence (the development and integration of different professional experiences), and flexibility (the ability to adapt to intervention needs). Internal Medicine also deals with undefined or atypical clinical manifestations. In simple terms, an internist is considered the "specialist of complexity."

Within the Unit of Internal Medicine, which has 95 beds, there are 8 beds for admission and short-term stays that serve as a second-level triage aimed at: 1) stabilizing and monitoring patients admitted from the Emergency Room; 2) observing and defining the diagnostic pathway for patients admitted from the Emergency Room; 3) discharge within 5 days or admission to the various sections of the ward as standard, depending on specialist skills and the level of care required.

The Internal Medicine Unit also accepts patients from other wards or from the Intensive Care Unit who are in stable hemodynamic condition, or directly from its own outpatient clinics (Medical Angiology, Allergology and Clinical Immunology, Dyslipidemia) or from the specialist outpatient clinics of Units that do not have beds (Endocrine, Metabolic and Nutritional Diseases, Medical Oncology, Radiotherapy, Rheumatology). Patients can also undergo further diagnostic or follow-up tests within 30 days of discharge, including via telemedicine.

Comprehensive nursing care is provided with specific support as needed (social, rehabilitation, diet therapy, etc.). Additionally, patients can return for follow-up exams or further tests within 30 days of discharge, even through telemedicine.

Nursing care is comprehensive and tailored to each patient's needs, including support in areas like social care, rehabilitation, and diet.

The Unit fully supports the rights outlined in the European Charter of Patients' Rights.

The Unit is divided into three wards, with three dedicated nursing coordinators, for a total of 95 beds.

Services

Medical angiology (consultation)
Colour Doppler ultrasound, ultrasound of the upper or lower limbs or arterial district
Diagnosis and treatment of dyslipidaemia
Arterial hypertension (consultation)
Allergology (consultation and testing for inhalant, food, contact and drug allergens)
Clinical immunology (consultation)
Vaccine therapy for inhalants and hymenoptera venom

Regular consultations are booked at the Centralised Appointment Service upon request by a general practitioner or specialist.

Admission procedures

1. Urgent admission from the Emergency Department
2. Urgent admission arranged by the ward after an outpatient consultation
3. Elective or scheduled admission

Areas of specialisation

The Unit is currently developing a particular interest and commitment in the following fields:

1. Bedside clinical ultrasound diagnostics, both in the cardiac and peripheral vascular fields and in Internal Medicine (mainly abdominal).
2. Study and treatment of endocrine-metabolic and metabolic diseases, in collaboration with the Endocrine, Metabolic, and Nutritional Diseases Unit. The department has gained significant experience in diagnosing and treating endocrine diseases, particularly autoimmune-related conditions (e.g., Addison's disease, autoimmune polyendocrine syndromes).
3. Angiological diagnostics and study of thrombotic and hemorrhagic diseases.
4. Immunoallergology.
5. Second-level treatment of dyslipidemia.

Office hours for clinical updates to family members
Monday to Friday from 12:00 to 13:00, subject to agreement with the Nursing Coordinator of the relevant ward.

How to speak with doctors about clinical information

The attending physician will contact you by phone after the first visit, in addition to providing updates during the hospital stay at the physician's discretion after 1:00 p.m. In case of urgent communications, the attending physician will contact the family members as soon as possible. Any in-person meetings (day and time) must be agreed upon with the attending physician.

Visiting hours for external visitors

Weekdays and holidays from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. and from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. One visitor per patient is allowed.

Outside these times, visitors may remain in the ward in special cases and upon request to the ward doctor or doctor on duty. However, we ask that you limit the number of people visiting the same patient at any one time to no more than one person. We also recommend that you wash your hands with the detergent provided in the ward, both on arrival and on departure.
